

#### ABOUT PHOTOSENSITIVE SEIZURES

A very small percentage of people may experience a seizure when exposed to certain visual images, including flashing lights or patterns that may appear in video games. 

# **Creating Your Player**

The first time you play *Links 2004*, you'll need to create your player. If you ever want to make changes to your player, or create a new player, select **My Player** from the Main Menu.

#### To create your player

- 1. Enter a name for your player, and then press A.
- 2. Select a character style and create your player's look. Don't press (A) until you've selected all the options!
- 3. Choose your weapons! (Note that some of the Pro Golfers can only use their real-life brands.) When you're finished, press (8).
- 4. Pick a nickname to be used by the in-game commentators, and then select a difficulty level. When you're finished, press .

tip—A player's difficulty level cannot be changed once the profile is saved.

5. Assign Skill Points; you start with \$30,000 (see next page).

tip—Shaft and Ball Bonuses are equipment upgrades earned by winning Skill Events in Career Play (see page 25).

6. Press (A) to save your Profile and your player is ready to go!

## **Difficulty Levels**

- **Beginner:** Power Meter displayed with *recommended power line* (see page 16); full putting assistance; forgiving on errant swings.
- Intermediate: Power Meter displayed without recommended power line; less putting assistance; less forgiving on errant swings.
- Advanced: No Power Meter displayed; little putting assistance; errant swings fully penalized; wind realistically affects ball flight.

### **Skill Points**

Skill Points are bought with cash earned by playing well in single rounds, Career Play tournaments, and Skill Events. Up to 20 Skill Points can be applied to each of four attributes:

- · Power: Hit shots farther.
- Control: Get more spin control (see page 17).
- Putting: Extend and narrow the Putting Assistant (see page 20).
- Recovery: Hit better chip, flop, and punch shots (see page 19).

### To buy Skill Points

- 1. From the Main Menu, select My Player, select a Profile, and then select Buy Skill Points.
- 2. If you have enough money, press Up/Down to select an attribute and Right/Left to apply a Skill Point.

## **Tutorial**

After creating a player, continue on to the Tutorial; learn to play Links 2004 and earn an extra \$40,000 to buy more Skill Points!

# My Player Options

To change a player's attire or equipment, or view stats, Skill Points, and saved shots, select **My Player** from the Main Menu.



## SINGLE ROUND

Except for preestablished rounds (such as Career Play tournaments) you'll need to select rules, player count, a course, and conditions.

## Rules (Modes of Play)

- **Stroke:** Standard rules; players compete individually to complete a round in the fewest number of strokes.
- Match: Two players compete to win a majority of individual holes.
- Nassau: A Stroke Play variation; players compete for the lowest score on the Front 9, Back 9, and Overall—each worth one point.
- Skins: Players compete to win individual holes—each worth a skin.
- **Stableford:** A Stroke Play variation; instead of counting total strokes, *points* are awarded: double eagles are worth 8, eagles 5, birdies 2, pars 0, bogeys -1, and double bogeys or worse -3.
- Best Ball: Two-player teams compete, with the teammates playing individually and using the better score on each hole.
- Alternate Shot: Two-player teams compete, with the teammates taking every other shot.

## Player Count and CPU Players

Some modes of play require an exact player count; others let you decide how many Human Players (you and friends) and CPU Players (Annika Sörenstam, Mike Weir, Sergio Garcia, Jesper Parnevik, and others) will play the round.

### To select players for the round

- 1. Set the Player Count, and then press (A).
- 2. Highlight your Profile, and then press (A). If you're playing alone, you're done!
  - 3. Select your opponent's Profile (if applicable), and then press **A**.
    - Select a Profile and press for each CPU Player (when highlighted, difficulty levels and skill ratings [1-20] are displayed).

#### **Courses**

When you first play *Links 2004*, you have four courses to choose from:

- Aviara: A gorgeous seaside course in sunny Southern California.
- **Greywolf**: A mountainous, heavily forested course with treacherous greens and drastic elevation changes.
- Mauna Lani: An island course, featuring lush terrain and lava beds.
- · Superstition Mountain: An oasis in the heart of the Arizona desert.

### **Locked Courses**

Four other courses are unlocked in Challenges; one in Career Play.

- · New South Wales: One of Australia's finest; a classic links course.
- Oakmont: A legendary North American course with extensive bunkering.
- Loch Lomond: 18 holes nestled on ancient Scottish shores.
- St Andrews: Perhaps the most renowned course in the world of golf...where it all began.
- Ocean Mill: Experience the ultimate fictional course, available only by successfully completing Career Play.

## **Round Options**

- Mulligans: Choose from None to Unlimited. A Mulligan is a re-hit taken without a penalty.
- Holes: Select Front 9, Back 9, or all 18.
- Tees: Select Championship (hardest), Back, Middle, or Forward; this determines which tee box you'll hit from.
- Pin Positions: Select Difficult, Medium, or Easy; this determines the difficulty of the hole location on each green.
- Conditions: Select Clear, Cloudy, Rainy, or Foggy; moisture will affect ball flight, roll, green speed, and so on.
- Wind: Select Calm, Breezy, or Windy; ball flight will be affected depending on the velocity and direction of the wind.

## **CLUB SELECTION**

## HITTING THE BALL

#### **Automatic Club Selection**

Before each shot, a club is automatically selected for you (displayed in the lower-left corner of the Game Screen), but you're free to select a different club...and probably *should* in certain situations (below).

#### To change clubs

Pull **L** or **B** until the club you want is selected.

tip—A lower-numbered club hits the ball with less arc (loft), so it goes further. Changing to a lower-numbered club is called "clubbing down" or "taking an extra (or longer) club."

- Terrain: You'll usually need to take at least one extra club when hitting from the rough.
- Wind: With wind in your face, take more club; take less club if it's at your back. Strong winds can make club selection very tricky!
- Uphill Lie: If the ball lies on an up-slope, your usual club will hit the ball like a more lofted club, so you may need a less lofted club.
- Downhill Lie: To negate the effects of a steep downhill lie, use a more lofted club than usual.
- Hitting from the Fringe: The Putter is automatically selected only when you're on the green; to putt from anywhere off the green, you'll need to change to the Putter.
- Obstacles: A club with more or less loft may help you hit over or under obstacles (such as trees).
- **Elevation**: Hitting downhill or uphill often requires a club change.

tip—Elevation change and direction is displayed near the Aim Marker (see next page). In general, go up or down one club for every 30- to 40-foot change in elevation.

## Aiming Your Shot

An Aim Marker is automatically aligned to the center of the fairway or pin at the expected length of the selected club.



#### To move the Aim Marker

- - Press A for a close-up of the Aim Marker.
- 2. Press to move the Aim Marker.
- 3. When the Aim Marker is where you want it, press (A).

IMPORTANT! Moving the Aim Marker closer or further away changes the selected club; to disable this function (for the current shot only), press © [BACK]. Changing clubs always repositions the Aim Marker.

Several situations may require moving the Aim Marker:

- **Sidehill Lie**: If the ball is above a (right-handed) golfer's feet, the shot will tend to go left of the Aim Marker; a ball below the golfer's feet will tend to go right.
- Wind: A strong crosswind could move the ball drastically; aim *into* the crosswind to compensate.
- Angled Landing Area: The ball may roll right or left on tilted surfaces; aim to allow for the roll.
- **Obstacle**: Aim slightly left or right to avoid trees, hazards, and so on.
- Dogleg: A dogleg is a hole with a sharply bent fairway. Often, you can place the Aim Marker to cut the corner and have the hole play much shorter.

# HITTING THE BALL

# Real Time Swing

For Beginner and Intermediate players, a Power Meter is displayed to help gauge the swing. For Beginners only, there is also a yellow recommended power line for each shot. There is no Power Meter for Advanced players. The instructions below are for the Beginner difficulty level.



#### To make a full swing

- 1. Move © Down (toward you) in a straight line to start the backswing.
- 2. When the yellow power bar reaches the yellow recommended power line, move Up (away from you) in a straight line to follow through and hit the ball.

tip—The recommended power line is only an estimate; shot distance is determined by many factors, including club selection, lie, wind, swing speed, and tempo.

#### Overswing

For maximum power, pause at the height of the backswing; the controller starts to vibrate and the clubhead glows. Don't pause too long; the overswing power will drop quickly. And be warned: the added power could make a poor shot even worse.

#### **Power**

The longer the backswing and the faster the follow-through, the harder you'll hit the ball, but accuracy and distance also depend on the smoothness of the stroke (tempo) and how squarely you hit the ball (accuracy).

#### Tempo

Good tempo—a smooth backswing, and a firm (but not rushed) follow-through, executed with consistent speed and without stopping the motion—will help you make accurate shots without sacrificing power.

#### **Accuracy**

Hooks and slices are caused by getting out of alignment during the swing. Try to move **9** straight Down and then straight Up.

tip—A hook—a shot pulled left (by a right-handed golfer)—leaves a yellow trail (called a tracer). A slice—a shot pushed right—has a blue tracer. Straight shots have a white tracer.

## Spin Control

The Spin Control Gizmo gives you control over how the ball spins, allowing you to hit draws and fades, stop the ball quickly, get extra roll upon landing, or spin your approach shot back toward the hole.



#### To use Spin Control

- 1. Before you swing, move 10 to display the Spin Control Gizmo.
- Move in the direction you want the ball to spin—Left to curve left, Right to curve right, Up to decrease the spin; Down to increase the spin.
- 3. While still holding in place, execute your swing.

tip—By adding Skill Points to the Control attribute, you'll get more spin and have more control over it!

#### **Draws and Fades**

For a right-handed golfer, a draw is a shot that curves slightly to the left; a fade curves to the right. Hooks and slices are, respectively, extreme draws and fades. Intentional draws and fades can be achieved by using the Spin Control Gizmo to spin the ball in the direction you want the shot to go.

# **CHIPPING AND PUTTING**

# Using the Shot Types Gizmo

There are six Shot Types; each one is used in specific situations. As with clubs, a recommended Shot Type is automatically selected before each shot.

Putt—A shot made with the Putter, usually on or near the green.

Flop—A short, hard swing with the club face open, used to hit the ball a very short distance with an extremely high trajectory so the ball sticks when it lands. Straight—The standard full swing; also used for partial swings and picks (sand shots in which the ball is picked cleanly off the sand surface).



Punch—Also known as a knock-down shot, used to keep the ball trajectory low (to hit under a tree, roll longer, and/or stay out of the wind).

Blast—A sand shot in which the club hits into the sand behind the ball, causing an explosion of sand and hitting the ball a relatively short distance.

Chip—A short, controlled swing, used to hit the ball a short distance, usually near the green.

### To change the Shot Type

- 1. Before a shot, press and hold **B** to display the Shot Types Gizmo.
- 2. Move while holding to change the selected Shot Type.
- 3. When you're done, release B.

# Partial Swings

Some shots require a *partial* swing to get the right distance. Known as *soft* shots (for example, a soft 6 iron), these are executed by either shortening the backswing or slowing the follow-through slightly.

# Chipping

A chip is a short shot with a lofted club, usually used near the green. For Beginner and Intermediate players, the Power Meter functions much like it does with a full swing, but the swing is shorter and more controlled. There are two basic ways to use the Chip Shot Type:

- Standard Chip: Hit the ball with the usual trajectory; the ball will roll toward the hole.
- Bump-and-Run: Use a less lofted club and shorten the swing; the ball will have a lower trajectory, land early, and roll longer.

### Other Short Shot Types

- Flop: A flop shot is used when there is very little green between your ball and the pin. It's a tricky shot with little margin of error, but sometimes it's your best and only option.
- Putt: A putt may be the best strategy if you're on the fringe or on the fairway just off the green and have a clear path to the hole.

tip—To maximize the effectiveness of chip, punch, and flop shots, apply Skill Points to your player's Recovery attribute.

#### Sand Shots

There are two strategies for hitting from the sand:

- **Blast**: Use this Shot Type to hit a short shot, such as when hitting out of a greenside bunker.
- Pick: If you're in a fairway bunker and need to hit a longer shot, select the Straight Shot Type and make a normal swing—the club will pick the ball off the sand surface.

# CHIPPING AND PUTTING

# Putting

To make a putt, you'll need to read the green, use the Putting Assistant to find your line, set the Aim Marker, and putt with good tempo and just the right power...putting is not easy! You can use the Putter anytime, but it's automatically selected only if you're on the green.



#### To select the Putter

- 1. Pull or until the Putter is selected.
- 1. Press and hold B to display the Shot Types Gizmo.
- 2. Move while holding to select Putt, and then release •.

### Reading the Green

There are three tools to help you line up your putts:

**Grid:** Click **1** to display a grid, making the terrain contours easier to read.

Putting Camera: Press ® to get a ground-level view of the putting surface between the ball and the hole.

**Putting Assistant:** The Putting Assistant is a blue line that automatically displays the direction your putt will roll (depending on speed). For Beginner players, the line is very narrow and extends up to 30 feet; for Intermediate and Advanced players, the line is shorter and wider.

tip—By applying Skill Points to your player's Putting attribute, you can add length and focus to the Putting Assistant for every difficulty level.

### **Aiming Your Putt**

When putting, the Aim Marker always starts out near the hole. Unless the green is perfectly flat (leaving you with a straight putt), you will need to reposition the Aim Marker!

### To aim your putt

- 1. Press to move the Aim Marker.
- 2. When the Putting Assistant is in line with the hole, press (A).

tip—Press (a), and then move the Aim Marker to get a top view of the Putting Assistant.

## The Putting Stroke

When using the Putting Power Meter, the longer the backswing, the harder it is to control your putt. Smooth tempo is especially important when putting and even more so with short putts!

#### **Automatic Gimmes**

Very short putts (1 foot or less; 2 feet or less for Beginners) are automatic *Gimmes*, meaning you get to sit back and watch as your player steps up to the ball and taps it into the hole. This Gimme feature cannot be disabled or customized.

#### Scorecard

- Holes: Each Hole column displays par for the hole, score made on the hole (if completed), yardage, and handicap.
- Handicap: The ranking of the holes: 1 is the most difficult and 18 is the easiest.
- Out/In/Total: Out refers to the Front 9; In refers to the Back 9 (holes 10-18); Total is the overall score.
- Mul: Total number of Mulligans taken during the current round.

### Dropping

After you hit into a hazard, your ball is automatically dropped to a playable spot. You can choose to drop at any other time (unless you're on a tee box), but there is always a one-stroke penalty, with the exception of dropping from a cart path or other man-made structure.

### **Options**

- Game: Set distances to display in yards or meters; turn the Xbox controller vibration on/off; turn Hole Previews on/off.
- Sound: Set the volume or turn on/off all voices, sound, and music; set up and play User Soundtracks.
- · Graphics: Adjust the brightness.
- **Credits**: See who made the *Links 2004* experience possible!

#### **User Soundtracks**

Play your own music in *Links 2004* by importing audio tracks (refer to the Xbox manual), selecting **Options** from the Main Menu or Pause Menu, and then **Sound**. Set User Soundtracks to **Linear** or **Shuffle**.

#### Free Roam Camera

You can explore every square inch of every course using the Free Roam feature. Press , and then move and to steer and pull to return to move up/down. Press to return to your ball.

# New Equipment

After completing some Skill Events in Career Play, you'll be notified that you've earned an equipment upgrade, such as a new club shaft type or special spin or distance golf ball.
